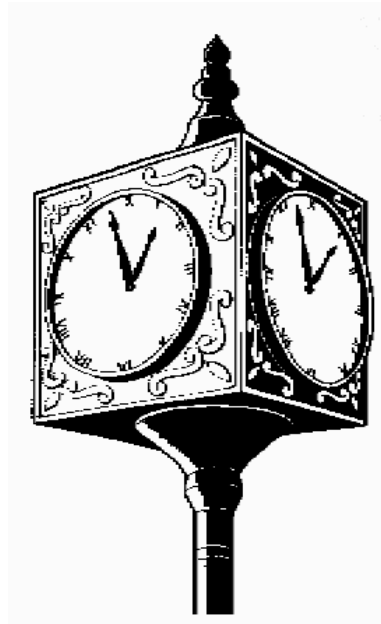
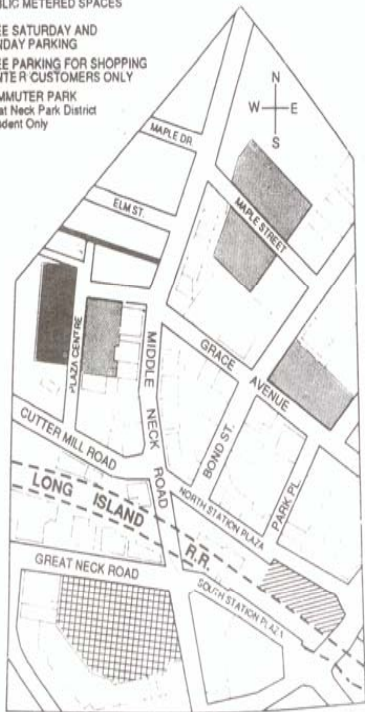

Did You Know....?

...It Is a Violation to:

**PARK LONGER THAN THE
DESIGNATED TIME LIMIT
IN OUR PARKING LOTS**

The information inside this brochure explains common violations of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law and the Great Neck Plaza Village Parking Code, of which you may be unaware. The village's regulations are contained in Local Law 4 of 1996.

Available Parking Spaces - Daily, Monday Thru Friday

Street Parking.....	630
Metered Lots.....	476
Garage Parking (with permits).....	758
Total.....	1,864

Parking in the Gussack Plaza and Maple Garages is FREE in all spaces (both metered and permit spaces) weekdays after 3:00 p.m. until 9:00 a.m., Monday through Friday, and all day on Saturdays and Sundays.

Note: Meters in the surface lots are in effect and are NOT free during these periods, except Sunday—On Sundays, all meters and parking spaces are free.

Parking Meters

Hours of Operation:

9 A.M. to 6 P.M. Monday to Saturday.

On Sundays, meters are “free.”



Because of the high demand for parking, and the many needs serviced in our village, appropriate time limits are imposed to allow for the maximum use and turnover of available spaces. Generally, we have 2-hr. on-street parking, and 4-hr. parking spaces in our surface municipal lots.

A vehicle may **not** be parked in a short term metered space (4 hours or less) longer than the time limit designated — regardless of additional coins deposited into the meter. This practice is illegal and is known as **“Feeding the Meter.”**

A vehicle may **not** be parked in a time zone longer than the time limit designated by the sticker inside the head of the meter, which reads “2 hour” or “4 hour” limit.

And here’s the point:

Short term, on-street parking provides for the most convenient access for customers to neighboring businesses and services. To insure convenience and turnover, a vehicle may not be re-parked within a parking lot, or on the street, in order to avoid the time limitation.

Persons who purposefully take actions to avoid the parking time restriction, can result in the issuance of additional penalties, in terms of receipt of a personal appearance summons.



What if the meter reads “DEAD” or “OUT OF ORDER,” can I still park at this space?

Yes, you may park your vehicle at a meter that registers “Dead” or “Out of Order,” in our short-term metered lots (4 hours, 2 hours, or less), if you first call and notify the Village and park not longer than the designated time limit.

Note: Please call Village Hall, Front Desk, at 482-4500 to report a malfunctioning parking meter so we can investigate it and fix the meter.

The parking meters are changing:

We have re-programmed our parking meters in the Village of Great Neck Plaza to provide you with a five-minute grace period at the end of your paid time. These extra five (5) minutes are on us! The parking meter heads have stickers indicating that this parking space is a friendly-meter, meaning it has been re-programmed for the 5-minute grace period. We want you to enjoy your time here, and make it easier for your shopping/dining experience in Great Neck Plaza!

Parking garages:

There are specially designated parking permit spaces in our structured parking garages that are provided for persons who work in the Village of Great Neck Plaza and pay for a permit on a quarterly basis, presently at \$90 per quarter. It is cheaper for a full time merchant to buy a permit, then to feed the meter all day.
